2019 GATE Identification

The 2019-2020 school year GATE identification test will be administered at the District Office for students currently in $2^{nd} - 7^{th}$ grade. The students will take the Otis-Lennon School Ability Test, OLSAT, that tests abstract thinking and reasoning ability. Students must attend one of the testing dates on the OLSAT Parent Permission Form in order to complete the testing by the district. The Parent Permission Forms will be made available on November 1, 2018 on our district website @ www.rcsdk8.org under the "Parent" tab. All forms *must* be returned to the District Office by January 11, 2019 if you would like your student tested. There are *no exceptions* as materials are ordered based on the number of returned forms. Make sure you check the RCSD website for more information regarding GATE services and testing. Click on the Main Menu and then under Programs – Gifted and Talented Education.

Were you impacted by Recent Wildfires? Food Resources for Camp Fire Survivors

November 2018

1. You can always apply for **CalFresh Food**, which provides food benefits on an EBT card for eligible people with low-incomes:

a. Apply In-person:

Butte Community Employment Center - Chico 2445 Carmichael Drive Chico, CA 95928

b. Apply Online:

C4Yourself.com or GetCalFresh.org

2. If you already receive CalFresh Food:

Butte Community Employment Center -Oroville 78 Table Mountain Blvd Oroville, CA 95965

a. Your benefits may be replaced on your EBT card *automatically* as early as November 20th. But if you were receiving CalFresh when the fire began, did not receive the automatic replacement benefits, and did experience food loss, you may apply for replacement benefits **individually** at Butte

County Employment & Social Services. **b.** You may keep access to your food benefits as long as you qualify. If you need a replacement EBT card, have a report due, or have any questions about your ongoing case, you can contact Butte or, if you are residing outside of Butte County, *any* county social service office in the State.

3. All people with CalFresh Food can now buy prepared or hot foods – for example, from a grocery store deli – at EBT retailers through December 17, 2018 in Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Plumas, Sutter, Yuba, and Tehama Counties.

4. You can pick up a box of food from your community food bank. The Disaster Household Distribution Program will be running November 26 - December 9 in Butte County and surrounding areas. For the latest distribution schedule, check:

5. If you do not receive CalFresh, you can apply for one month of special **Disaster CalFresh Food** benefits, during a one-week application period planned to begin in early December.

People receiving CalFresh may also receive a supplement to their benefit amount during this time, up to the maximum allowable amount per households. *More information coming in early December*.
