A Message from Mrs. Patrick

We are already in the 8th week of school, so it is time to reiterate how important student attendance is. There are several reasons why regular attendance at school is important for our students:

First, it is difficult for young students to learn if they are not in class. The learning process builds upon itself, with each lesson presented to students based upon or related to those that preceded it. A child who misses one day of school also misses a day of education which cannot be retrieved. Research shows that those children who attend school regularly are much more likely to be successful during their school years.

Success after graduation is a **second** reason for regular school attendance. Young people develop the habits of good attendance and prompt completion of assignments while they are in school. Their success as adults in their chosen occupations is dependent upon these habits.

Thirdly, our students' success in their school years is directly related to the importance that parents attach to education. If you believe and act as if your child's education is important, then your child will most likely believe it as well. This starts with regular attendance. When parents believe that consistent attendance is important and communicate that belief to their children starting in the elementary years, unnecessary absences from school will be dramatically reduced.

Our students should attend school every day, all day and on time unless an illness or emergency prevents them from doing so. Together, parents, school administration and teachers, we can help our children develop proper attitudes about attendance. In an effort to support attendance, California State Law and Roseville City School District Policy was developed. When a child has three unexcused absences, three unexcused late arrivals in excess of 30 minutes, or a combination of the two, parents will receive the first truancy letter. The process is cumulative, and additional truancy letters will be sent upon the 4th, 5th, and 6th unexcused absence/late. If the process progresses to the 4th letter, you will be required to appear before the SARB (School Attendance Review Board), which consists of members from the District, social services, and law enforcement,

Please make every effort to ensure your child is at school every day, and on time. Thank you for your help!
